
Over the next short period, we will be getting ever closer to celebrating Easter, the worst and best days of the year in my humble opinion, the death, but then resurrection of our Saviour.

The A.G.M. and the next Church Meeting are planned for Tuesday 16th January 2024 (7.30pm) in the Coffee House. This will be a Hybrid Meeting, meaning that people will also be able to "attend" via Zoom.

Do we listen when God speaks to us?

Over the past few weeks, indeed months, many people in our Church Family have faced numerous challenges with health issues, family difficulties and continuing financial worries. We seem to hear nothing but bad news, with strikes, NHS waiting lists, knife attacks, murders, the cost of living crisis, the climate crisis and conflicts and wars around the world. We despair at the death and destruction in the Ukraine and in the Middle East!

It is very easy to feel worried, anxious, depressed and totally helpless in such dark and troubled times. Indeed, many have spoken about feeling that we are under attack; and several have advised us to stay strong in our faith, with hope in Jesus, the light in the darkness, and to put our armour on for the fight (Ephesians 6). In a recent service, I spoke about these things, and even chose as our opening hymn, "Onward Christian Soldiers!"

After that service, Liz Gilbert handed me some notes that she'd made regarding two visions that she had experienced, way back in November. They were:

Sun. 5th Nov.: "I saw the Earth from above, and as I looked a black cloud began to descend, firstly across Russia & China, then spreading outwards over the rest of Asia. Darkness. Ungodliness. I then turned back to look at the West. Here it was grey as if in twilight – all of the United States, the Americas and Europe – the so called Christian World!"

"Then, I noticed small dots of bright light appearing, scattered throughout the Earth (they included Blisworth!). I asked God what did this all mean? I was told that a great darkness is beginning to descend on the world and only the spirit-filled believers were the lights shining in the darkness. It is to be a time of great trouble and testing of our faith. Only true believers will survive. God says, 'Each light, however scattered, is very precious to Him!'"

"It is important that the true spirit-filled believers stand firm and true to the Gospel of Christ, and not be influenced by the darkness around them. The areas in shadow represent the so-called established Christian Church weakened and apostate as it is influenced by the secular world around it. Blisworth is one of the bright lights shining in the darkness and precious to God!"

Sun.12th **Nov.**: "I heard the sound of soft drumbeats gradually getting louder and louder. They were the sign of an impending battle calling us to arms. Then, I found myself in a line of believers, standing, fully armoured, under God's banner of 'Love'. We are called to be fully prepared for what lies ahead!"

Thank you for sharing this, Liz!!

Equally, many have had visions and spoken about what God is saying to them. We have heard messages about growing spiritually, as individuals and as a church, and about

spreading the Word, the good news about Jesus. We keep asking God for guidance about how He wants our church to move forward, but is it possible that He keeps telling us and showing us? Are we listening to Him? Are we acting on what He is saying?

We need to grow and move forward individually, as Christians. We need to be strong, courageous, bold and united as we stand against the evil in our world. We need to share with others the wonderful news of Hope and Love that is on offer to everyone, as we journey forward in our relationship with Jesus! Jesus is the Light in the Darkness!

Nathan Toseland, one of the new BU Regional Ministers, recently visited us and his sermon was based on Phillipians Ch.3. He said that God had laid this on his heart to share with us in Blisworth. He talked about the importance and value of good relationships with like-minded people. He "felt" something special at BBC and encouraged us to "keep it going"! He emphasised the importance of rejoicing in the Lord, even in our worst moments. As Paul had said, when faced with challenges do not return to your old ways, don't go backwards, go forwards, the "good old days" were not that good! Build your relationship with Jesus, and face all that life throws at you. The suffering that we face today should be rendered to the past – it has no place in the Kingdom! At the end of it all is Joy in Jesus. We are citizens of Heaven.

Ruth, in her recent sermon, also spoke about issues relating to us being "under attack". She shared that this is not just in a spiritual way but also in a range of things affecting our everyday lives, and she provided numerous shocking examples of how so many of the basic morals and principles of our culture and society are being eroded. This is happening now! What are we doing about it? Are we going to make a stand and act, or are we going to hide in the shadows and let this happen to us?

When God speaks to us, do we listen? Do we actually hear what He is saying to us? Do we act upon what God is saying and telling us to do? Or, do we keep saying that we are waiting for God to tell us and show us what He wants us to do?

This Lent we are all invited to wait in hopefor God to meet us and sustain us through the storms and trials life brings.


